I'll send Matt an email, but I do have a few questions and thoughts.

I'm not completely clear what is desired in terms of dining consultation. The original purpose of the project was to analyze the efficiency of Union space usage and make recommendations that could be implemented through a strategic planning process. Is that how everyone still sees it? Or has the original plan morphed into something else that I'm not aware of? If the desire is to analyze concepts and what dining options should be in the building, then in my mind that is a completely different project.

The recommendations that come from this analysis could, but not necessarily, include some renovations. If we decide to do any major renovations, we would go through a formal RFP process which would include Facilities Planning.

If the cost to add this new consultant to the team is extensive, is that a Union cost or a Dining cost or a Facilities Planning cost since they are requesting it? What will this consultant tell us about the dining space that Alm2s can't or that we don't already know?

Will Matt just be renegotiating the contract proposal? Will I, or Eric and I, still retain primary contact and work directly with Brad at Alm2s?

With the current delays, we will not have the final deliverables until late into the spring semester, at my best guess. Just an FYI.

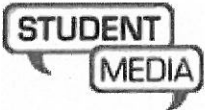

The current space allocation is outright prime for how student media ought to work. Our being in the Student Union has aided considerably in the way in which we conduct our business. It allows us to be closer to possible story material, it allows for ease in interviews and it allows for ease in our distribution. With our location, we have been able to rush out to breaking stories on campus, see possible stories develop from our windows and be easily accessed by individuals with story proposals. As an entity comprised of students, our current space allocation is just plain convenient in general.
